

# Anafae at a Glance

ANAFAE is engaged in the education and qualification of the young generations. They are the future assets of the country and form nearly 70 % of the population.

During 2006 to 2015, nearly 950.000 young learners at the age of 15 to 25 years participated successfully in our short and education programmes, medium term provided by a network of 22 Adult Education and Community Learning Centres in 12 provinces, jointly establish with the support German Association - DVV International. Nearly 32.24% of our learners are women.

## Supplements to school education and university

The school programmes of the ALC/CLC Network support students in grades 9 - 12, to successfully accomplish public education complementary through instructions. especially in natural sciences subjects.

Other education programmes open access to higher education. Also university students can supplement their knowledge in science subjects and attain additional qualifications in our Adult Learning Centres.

## Community-based education programs

ANAFAE operates 8 Community Learning Centres in close cooperation with the local communities. The CLCs are secure and accepted places of learning, especially for girls and young women. CLCs support local development and are a hub for other public

private service within the local communities.

#### Literacy Education for Empowerment

In our literacy education programmes about 80% of the participants are young married ladies. They learn reading, writing and reflect on their role numeracy, responsibilities in family and community, and gain valuable new knowledge to deal with health problems at their homes and to improve nutrition and hygiene within their families. In addition, they develop ideas for their own economic activity. Literacy Education has a direct, positive effect on family health and school attendance of children.



We actively contribute to the development and the implementation of the National Literacy Strategy. Professional dialogue, bundling resources through mutual cooperation and effective coordination with other literacy education actors is our main focus at national and provincial level

Our literacy education programmes strengthen the capacities of individuals and of the communities and support their empowerment.

# Promoting employability among youth for the Afghanistan of tomorrow

The present education system is not able to provide young people with sufficient qualifications and competences for the labour market or the development of the economy.

Our programmes are the best investment for poverty reduction. Connecting education and employment, they promote young people's transition to working life. The education programmes of ANAFAE improve skills, competences and the employability of young people for the labour market in fields. various Like in Information Technology IT, hardware and software, office and database programmes, computer graphic, video and picture editing, server network installation, web design, hardware repair, through Office English and other qualifications in finance, business and office work related spheres. Accounting finance management courses are



conducted for women, e.g. at the Kabul Women ALC.

In addition, basic vocational training courses, tailoring and weaving, beauty care, mobile phone repair and courses for IT hardware and network technicians, etc. are conducted. With increased opportunities, new qualifications, skills and competences, young people make important contributions to economic growth and social change - for the Afghanistan of tomorrow.

#### Cooperation with partners

German Association for Adult Education – DVV International from 2006 to 2015.

HAGER International in 2010. Literacy education and vocational training for victims of human trafficking in protected shelters to increase their education capacities their social, cultural and economic status.

GIZ-DED in 2010, supporting the management and administration of three Vocational Training Centres in Mazar, Kunduz and Faiz Abad.

GIZ PIU in 2009 - 2010. Establish a Literacy Education Programme for Afghan National Police (ANP) in 63 ANP police districts of the Northern Zone for up to 6.000 learners.

IOM in 2009. Development of training manuals, trainings to prevent human trafficking in Kabul, Balkh and Herat provinces for 5.000 participants.

GIZ-BEPA (Basic Education Programme) in 2009. Implementation of an assessments on literacy education needs in four districts of the Badakhshan province. Operation of nine-month literacy classes for 430 learners. Facilitation of civic education trainings with the learners of these literacy classes.

JICA LEAF Programme 2006 to 2007. Assessments on literacy education needs in four districts of the Balkh province. Operating literacy education classes with civic education components for 2.250 learners. Facilitation of literacy classes with a strong focus of community development for 1,250 learners in Kabul districts.

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
